
Flip & Dashers – The Champions – Terry & Kasia

Redevelopment Update from Robert Dowler, Chairman

After an enormous amount of work by architects, planning consultants, ecology consultants, etc. a scheme for the redevelopment of the Home was produced and discussed at pre-application meetings with the Planning Officers of Elmbridge Borough Council our application was submitted to the Council for consideration by the Planning Committee and included on the agenda of the meeting of the Committee on 26th November. At that meeting an issue was raised as to whether the proposal was of sufficient size to warrant a more wide-ranging environmental assessment, the decision on that point being made by the Secretary of State in Whitehall. The Committee however took a vote on our application and unanimously voted to refuse consent.

However the environmental assessment issue being unresolved at the time of the meeting meant that a formal Notice of Refusal could not be issued and the application was therefore carried forward to the February meeting of the



Planning Committee. At that meeting the Planning Committee once more voted to refuse consent unanimously. The main grounds for refusal are that the development in their opinion represents overdevelopment of the site and would have an adverse effect on the character of the area. The benefits which the scheme would bring to the borough appear to be totally ignored.

Needless to say this decision has caused great disappointment to all of us who have been working on the scheme for many many months and this disappointment is shared with our friends and families.

Together with Sheppard Trust we are therefore now taking advice on the matter of making an appeal against the decision of the Planning Committee and are consulting one of the leading barristers in the field of planning whose advice is awaited.

We shall report further as matters progress.

The word 'March' comes from the Roman 'Martius'. This was originally the first month of the Roman calendar and was named after Mars, the god of war. March was the beginning of our calendar year. We changed to the 'New Style' or 'Gregorian calendar in 1752, and it is only since then when we the year began on 1st January.

The Anglo-Saxons called the month *Hlyd monath* which means Stormy month, or *Hraed monath* which means Rugged month.



The game of marbles has been played for hundreds of years and some historians say that it might have been started by rolling eggs. In the past, round stones, hazelnuts, round balls of baked clay and even cherry stones have been used."
